Controlled Burning

Always report your planned control burn to avoid possible fire call costs. When burning grass, bush piles, stubble, etc. please be sure you are well-prepared and that you have fire guards in place. Call these burns into the Control Burn Centre at 1-866-404-4911.

Fire Insurance Coverage: Ratepayers are responsible for any firefighting charges when the Fire Department is called for a fire on your property, whether your parcel is occupied or vacant. Please be sure to have adequate Fire Insurance coverage.

Mowing and driveway summer blading are available ONLY IF YOU HAVE BEEN REGISTERED WITH THE RM OFFICE FOR THE CUSTOM WORK PROGRAM. For details, please call the RM Office. Custom work rates are as follows:

*Mowing \$165.00/hr. *Grading Lanes \$204.00/hr.

(minimum charge ½ hour rate)

The use of any equipment other than Municipal Equipment on Municipal road allowance is PROHIBITED. This includes clearing of snow, blading or dragging on road allowance with personal equipment leaving the RM at a high risk of liability including the Equipment owner.

Under the Zoning Bylaw, the RM of Laird No. 404 requires permits to be completed for any new development, construction or demolition on existing properties. Forms available on-line and at the RM office.

A building permit is separate from the development permit. A building permit refers to the building construction and compliance with the National Building Code and is governed by the RM Building Bylaw. Permit application forms are available at the RM office and on-line. Permits will not be issued until all applicable fees are paid. A Retention fee of \$1000.00 is applied at time of permitting and is refundable upon *completion of permit <u>PRIOR</u> to expiry date of permit.*

Truck Permits may be acquired from the RM Office. The Onus is on the individual of their rights and responsibilities regarding weight and load limits when hauling. Primary Weights on the municipal roads requires you to purchase a permit. Cost is \$25.00 per haul or an annual permit for \$100.00. 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Transporting of garbage must be secured so as not to lose debris during transportation. Payment for dumping of certain debris may be required, payment by cash or cheque.

Abandoned Wells

An abandoned water well poses a risk to people, livestock and equipment because it may be a deep, open pit that is usually unmarked. Abandoned wells also present a direct pathway for contaminants to move down into the underground aquifer, which can endanger the quality of water drawn from nearby water sources that are still in use. To properly decommission a well it is important to know these three things before you start:

- 1. What is the condition of the well and surrounding area?
- 2. What is the diameter of the well, depth to water and depth of well?

3. Based on the diameter of the well, is it a small diameter drilled well or large diameter bored well?

The Farm and Ranch Water Infrastructure Program (FRWIP) under the Canadian Agricultural Partnership (CAP) offers a rebate of **90 per cent of eligible costs** to a maximum payment of \$10,000 per project to help with well decommissioning.
